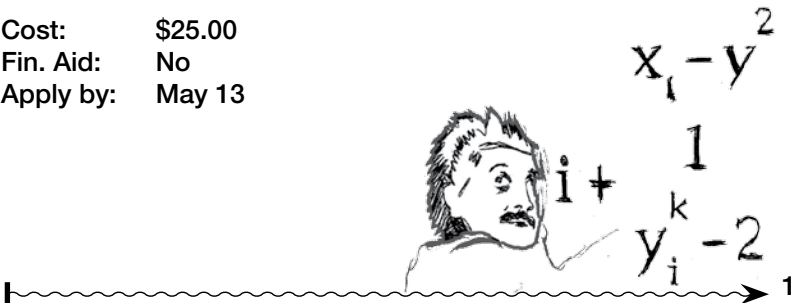
Rowan University's Attracting Women to Engineering (AWE)

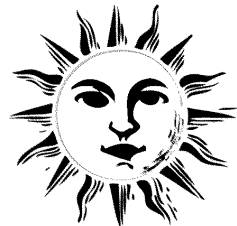
