Application Checklist:

All Applicants

- Apply Online:** gradstudy.rutgers.edu
- Application Fee:** \$65.00
- Essay:** Applicants are required to submit a statement of personal, professional, and academic goals. Visit camden.rutgers.edu for specific program requirements.
- Letters of Recommendation:** Refer to the chart for the number of recommendations that you are required to submit for your program.
- Standardized Test Scores:** Official copies of test (GRE, GMAT, LSAT, etc.) results must be sent to Rutgers–Camden. Specific test requirements are provided in the chart and are available online at camden.rutgers.edu. **Rutgers' GRE test code is 2092.**
- Transcripts:** Official transcripts must be sent directly to Rutgers–Camden from all universities and/or colleges that you have attended. Transcripts must be submitted in a sealed envelope with the university seal over the flap.
- Supporting Documentation for I-20 Issuance:** Students requiring an I-20 form to study at Rutgers must submit a Financial Statement–Certification of Funds form along with an original, currently dated, statement of account from a bank or other financial institution. The Financial Statement–Certification of Funds form and additional information about financial documentation are available online at gradstudy.rutgers.edu/inter.shtml#forms.
- International Transfer Students:** Students who are currently enrolled in another U.S. institution and who wish to transfer to Rutgers are also required to submit the Foreign Student Adviser's Report when and if admission is recommended. The form is available online at gradstudy.rutgers.edu/inter.shtml#forms. Additionally, please submit a copy of all previous I-20s you have been issued and a copy of your I-94.

International Students

- Test Requirements:** The Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) or the International English Language Testing System (IELTS) is required of all applicants whose undergraduate education was completed in a non-English speaking country. Even if you hold a master's-level degree from an institution in the United States or another English-speaking country, you must still take the TOEFL or IELTS test. Scores must be current, within two years of the applied semester.
- International Student Transcripts:** International applicants must enclose official transcripts in their native language and in English. The English translation must be professionally translated from all universities and/or colleges that you have attended. Applicants are responsible for supplying all necessary documentation needed, paying all necessary fees, and contacting an agency if required.
