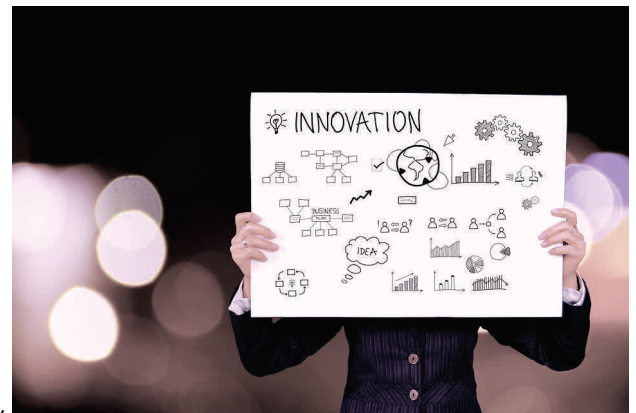

Rutgers Research Council Grants

The Rutgers Research Council is a faculty committee that advises the Office of Research and Economic Development (ORED) on faculty awards which are made as the result of peer review of requests submitted by the faculty for funding of research and other scholarly and creative activities. Applicants may request funds for research needs that include equipment, supplies, research assistance, publication costs, and travel expenses direct-

ly related to research or other creative projects up to \$5,000. All awards are made on a basis of merit, although priority is given to new faculty members.

Proposals are due by 5:00 p.m. on April 7, 2017. Late applications will not be accepted.

All proposals should be submitted to the Office of Research and Economic Development through the electronic

submission website.
